

As of today, December 07, 2009, The Embassy of the United State of America - Canada has the following guidelines for children crossing the Canadian border.

"CHILDREN: U.S. and Canadian children under the age of 16 will be able to present the original or copy their birth certificates, or other proof of citizenship such as a naturalization certificate or citizenship card. Groups of U.S. and Canadian children ages 16 through 18, when traveling with a school or religious group, social organization, or sports team will be able to enter under adult supervision with originals or **OFFICIAL** copies of their birth certificates or other proof of citizenship."

Anyone who will be over 18 must have a passport or passport card.

Please note that the copy of the birth certificate must be an **official copy** obtained from the city/state where they were born it. I was told it **cannot be a copy off of a copy machine.**
